Hello Mac Families. This month, we are dedicating our newsletter in honor of Moshe, our MAC student who passed away in October.



A note from Moshe's family:

Moshe was a very happy, loving teenager. He loved Baby Einstein, Thomas the Train and his iPad. Moshe was like a fish in the water and so fond of the pool and jacuzzi. We have many lovely memories, how he enjoyed playing in the water.

Three years ago, Moshe developed tonic clonic seizures. Please be aware that up to 30% of kids on the spectrum will develop seizures\epilepsy in their lifetime. It often occurs with onset of puberty. When your loved one develops seizures, they have to be under constant supervision around any water source! Bathtubs, jacuzzi, pool, ocean or lakes can become a drowning hazard.

When Moshe passed away, we got an immense comfort in the fact that we were able to donate his tissue, bones, vessels, heart valves and cornea. It will help up to 75 people to live a normal life again. Moshe was a trooper, we donated his brain to Autism Research and it will help to shed light on autism.

Thank you again, for all of the outpouring love and kindness. It gave us so much comfort during this difficult time in our life. Moshe was truly loved. We will be eternally grateful that we could enjoy him for nearly 16 years.

### Staff Spotlight



Jamilah Miller has made an incredibly positive impact on my son Gavin's life during the short time he's been in her class. He transitioned into her class when returning from 'shelter in place' in April 2021, and has accomplished something I never thought I'd witness - she helped him learn how to wait his turn! Waiting for anything has been a struggle for Gavin, especially if it's something he really wants. She worked closely with him for months on this, and did so using activities he enjoys such as sports and outdoor games.

One recent weekend afternoon while we were swimming, he jumped out of the water and ran towards the line of kids waiting for the diving board. I knew what was going to happen - he'd cut in front of the line unless I got there first and redirected him to wait at the end of the line.

But this time was different - he went to the back of the line and waited!

I owe this to Jamilah and her months of working with Gavin on waiting for 'your turn'.

Jamilah's concern for the well-being of the children in her class goes far beyond anything I've ever experienced at any other school. There was an issue with bus transportation when our school districts changed from middle to high school this fall, and Gavin was left stranded at school without a bus ride. Jamilah offered to drive him back to his group home! To say I felt relieved and grateful to Jamilah for this incredible act of kindness understates the positive impact she has had on my son and everyone who is blessed to know her. To know that my son is safe, supported, and loved so much every day that he goes to school is on the short list of things I'm most grateful for in my life.

Thank you Jamilah! You are truly a wonderful teacher and overall human!
