School Description and Mission Statement (School Year 2021-2022)

Morgan Autism Center is a private, nonprofit, nonpublic special education school that provides services for individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorders and other severe neurological disorders. Diagnoses include Autism, Asperger's Syndrome, Pervasive Developmental Disorder, Rett's Syndrome, Child Disintegrative Disorder, and related neurological and learning disorders. Many students have accompanying impairments such as epilepsy, cerebral palsy and visual or hearing impairments.

Our mission is to help children and adults with autism or other developmental disabilities maximize their potential in a dignified, positive and loving environment.

Opportunities for Parental Involvement (School Year 2021-2022)

Morgan Autism Center provides multiple opportunities for parental involvement. Parents are contacted daily by classroom teachers via notebook, phone or email to discuss pertinent daily issues and ongoing programming decisions. This daily communication and parental involvement is one of the hallmarks of our program and is often necessary in order to provide consistency for our students across the school and home environments. Teacher and support staff (SLPs, OTs) are available for individual meetings as needed. In addition to IEP development and daily communications with teachers, Morgan Autism Center supports parent groups, family activities, and school events. Morgan Autism Center has an active Parent Group. Meetings are held monthly and are facilitated by the parent volunteers. Morgan Autism Center administrators may attend to answer questions, provide support and resources, and plan "all school" activities. All of the above are intended to provide a sense of community for our parents. Morgan Autism Center operates under an open door policy. Parents are encouraged to visit classrooms and provide input.

Emergency Supplies: Each student has an emergency food packet that is kept in the classroom in case of a disaster.

- •Staff members supervise students bus arrivals and departures daily.
- Fire drills are conducted monthly.
- •COVID-19: Morgan Autism Center followed all state and county guidelines.
- •Lockdown/Shelter in place procedures are in place.
- •All visitors are required to sign in the office.
